About the HSE Sexual Health and Crisis Pregnancy Programme

The HSE Sexual Health and Crisis Pregnancy Programme (the Programme) is a national programme tasked with implementing Ireland's first framework for sexual health and wellbeing, the National Sexual Health Strategy 2015 – 2020. The Programme also has a statutory responsibility for the delivery of three mandates as originally set out within the Crisis Pregnancy Agency (Establishment) Order 2001 (S.I. No. 446 of 2001).


The Programme is one of a number of national policy priority programmes situated within the national Strategic Planning and Transformation function of the Health Service Executive.


The Programme delivers a programme of research; funding initiatives including crisis pregnancy counselling services and relationships and sexuality education programmes; communications campaigns; information provision and policy initiatives.

The Programme established the National Condom Distribution Service (NCDS) in October 2015 to assist in meeting the strategic aims of the National Sexual Health Strategy 2015–2020. The NCDS functions as a central point for distributing free condoms and lubricant sachets to HSE services and other organisations working directly with individuals and groups who may be at increased risk of negative sexual health outcomes.


NATIONAL CONDOM DISTRIBUTION SERVICE ACTIVITIES IN 2017

1. Introduction

The National Condom Distribution Service (NCDS) was established by the HSE Sexual Health and Crisis Pregnancy Programme (SHCPP) in October 2015 to assist in meeting the strategic aims of the National Sexual Health Strategy 2015–2020 to improve sexual health and wellbeing and reduce negative sexual health outcomes such as sexually transmitted infections and crisis pregnancies.

The NCDS functions as a central point for distributing free condoms and lubricant sachets to HSE services and other organisations working directly with individuals and groups who may be at increased risk of negative sexual health outcomes. These groups are listed in the National Sexual Health Strategy. The NCDS also provides condoms and lubricant sachets to support sexual health promotional campaigns and educational initiatives.

2. About this report

This report presents information on the activities of the NCDS from January 1 to December 31st 2017. The information presented in this report is based on (i) data provided by the services and organisations in their application forms to the service in 2017; (ii) logistical information recorded by Store-All Logistics, the company responsible for distributing the products; and (iii) monitoring information completed by the services and organisations in 2018 at the request of the SHCPP.

This report provides information on:

- Services and organisations that ordered products from the NCDS in 2017 and the at-risk groups and target audiences they work with.
- The number of products ordered in 2017 by service and organisations.
- Distribution of condoms and lubricant by services in 2017.

3. Products ordered by services and organisations

This section provides information about the services and organisations that ordered from the NCDS over the 12-month period January–December 2017. This section also provides information on the at-risk groups and target audiences the services and organisations work with.

In total, fifty-two services and organisations ordered condoms and/or lubricant sachets from the NCDS in 2017. Of these, fourteen were statutory services; thirteen were non-governmental organisations (NGOs) or community organisations; and twenty-five were student unions or student health centres.

Forty-seven of the services/organisations that ordered from the NCDS in 2017 operate on a local or regional basis, covering fourteen counties in the Republic of Ireland, and one in Northern Ireland. The remaining five services/organisations are national organisations.

Statutory Services¹

Fourteen statutory services received condoms and lubricant sachets from the NCDS in 2017. Twelve of these were HSE services and two were affiliated to Tusla. Among the twelve HSE services, eight were clinical services and four were non-clinical services.

¹ Statutory services refer to services/organisations that are established by legislation (HSE, Tusla) and are financed and provided by the government.

HSE clinical services

Eight clinical HSE services ordered from the NCDS in 2017, including the Gay Men's Health Service (GMHS), Dublin; HIV Clinical Services, Cork University Hospital; the Youth Health Service, Cork; and hospital-based STI services/clinics in Cork, Laois, Limerick, Waterford and the North East, including Louth and Monaghan.

The GMHS stated that they intended to distribute condoms and lubricant sachets to men who have sex with men (MSM), and the STI service in University Hospital Waterford stated that it intended to distribute condoms and lubricant sachets to the students from Waterford Institute of Technology who used their service. In addition, the Youth Health Service in Cork stated that it intended to distribute condoms to young people. The remaining clinical services stated that condoms and lubricant sachets would be distributed to the patients attending the clinical service.

HSE non-clinical services

Four HSE non-clinical services that ordered products from the NCDS in 2017 included the GMHS outreach service, HSE Health Promotion and Improvement in Longford and Killarney and the HSE SHCPP via the company Headcase Marketing, which operated the Johnny's GotYou Covered (JGYC) sexual health promotion campaign. The JGYC outreach campaign has been running since 2012 as part of the Think Contraception campaign to encourage young people to consistently practice safe sex.

• Tusla - Child and Family Agency

Two Tusla services engaged with the NCDS in 2017. These included Tullow Area School Completion Project (SCP) and Saol Nua – Intensive Family Support Service, Cork. While Saol Nua aimed to distribute condoms to a range of at-risk individuals, Tullow Area SCP uses condoms and lubricant for educational demonstration purposes with young people and students.

Non-Governmental Organisations/Community Organisations

In total, thirteen NGOs/community organisations ordered condoms and lubricant sachets from the NCDS in 2017. These organisations reported working with a range of different groups considered to be at an increased risk of experiencing negative sexual health outcomes. These groups include people who inject drugs, LGBT³, migrants, sex workers, young people, homeless people and people living with HIV or STIs. Some organisations also reported working with parents and carers of young people.

Student Unions and Student Health Centres

In total, twenty-four student unions and one student health centre ordered products from the NCDS in 2017. The Union of Students in Ireland (USI) made the application to the NCDS on behalf of its members, twenty-two of whom ordered condoms and lubricants from the NCDS. The remainder comprises the students union from Mary Immaculate College (MIC) in Limerick, which is independent from the USI, and the student health centre in Dublin City University (DCU) who applied directly to the NCDS.

4. Distribution of NCDS Products to services and organisations

This section provides information on the number of products ordered by services from the NCDS. The information was provided by the logistics company responsible for distributing the condoms and lubricant sachets to the HSE services and organisations, once the order has been approved by the NCDS project team.

Total Products Ordered

Condoms

A total of 405,621 condoms were distributed by the NCDS in 2017. Three in every five of these were distributed to statutory services. Student unions and student health centres received one fifth of the total and NGOs/community organisations received the remaining 9%.

• Lubricant sachets

A total of 205,095 lubricant sachets were distributed by the NCDS in 2017. Over two thirds were ordered by HSE services; student unions and health centres ordered one quarter of the total; and NGOs received 5%.

Figure 1: Proportion of condoms ordered in 2017 by service type





Figure 2: Proportion of lubricant sachets ordered in 2017 by service type



Statutory Services

• Condoms

288,470 condoms were ordered by and distributed to statutory services in 2017. Over half were ordered and distributed by the GMHS outreach service and 16.5% were ordered and distributed by the GMHS clinic comprising almost 70% of the total. Just over one fifth was ordered by the SHCPP via Headcase Marketing for distribution via the Johnny's GotYou Covered sexual health promotion outreach campaign.




Figure 3: Proportion of condoms ordered by statutory services as a share of total

• Lubricant sachets


141,719 sachets were ordered by eleven statutory services in 2017. Just over half of these were ordered by and distributed to the GMHS outreach service while one quarter of the total were ordered and distributed by the GMHS clinic, comprising almost 77% of the total ordered in 2017. Twenty per cent of the total was ordered by the SHCPP via Headcase Marketing for distribution via the Johnny's GotYou Covered sexual health promotion outreach campaign.

Figure 4: Proportion of lubricant sachets ordered by HSE services as a share of total




NGOs/Community Organisations

35,751 condoms were ordered and distributed to NGOs/community organisations in 2017. The Sexual Health Centre in Cork, AIDS West in Galway and GOSHH in Limerick ordered almost 75% of the total distributed to NGOs.

Figure 5: Proportion of condoms ordered by NGOs/community organisations as a share of total




Eleven NGOs/Community Organisations ordered lubricant sachets from the NCDS in 2017. Between these eleven organisations, they ordered a total of 10,550 lubricant sachets. Reflecting the trend among condom orders by NGOs/community organisations, the most substantial orders were placed by GOSHH, AIDS West and the Sexual Health Centre in Cork. These three organisations ordered almost 80% of the total amount of lubricant received by NGOs/community organisations in 2017 from the NCDS.

Student Unions and Health Centres

The USI ordered over half of the total amount of condoms ordered by student unions and health centres. Among the individual student unions, NCAD, UCC and NUIG received the most amounts each compared to the remaining unions.





Figure 7: Proportion of condoms ordered by student services/organisations as a share of total

The USI ordered the vast majority of lubricant sachets among the student union and health centre sector. Half of the USI-affiliated unions that ordered lubricant ordered 1,000 lubricant sachets each. MIC in Limerick placed the third largest order for lubricant sachets among the student unions and health centres. Seventeen student unions did not order any lubricant sachets from the NCDS in 2017, despite ordering condoms.

Key Activities and Events

There are a number of key activities and events during which services and organisations engage with atrisk populations with NCDS condoms and lubricant sachets, as well as sexual health promotion messages, information and interventions which are detailed below:

• Sexual Health Awareness and Guidance (SHAG) Week

SHAG week is a key event in the third level calendar, as it provides an opportunity to target students with sexual health promotion messages and materials. Five services and organisations (SHCPP, HSE Health Promotion Longford, AIDS West, GOSHH, USI) used SHAG week to distribute condoms and lubricant, alongside sexual health information to promote sexual wellbeing among the student population. SHAG week events were targeted by HSE services, NGOs, and student services/organisations alike. During SHAG week, these services and organisations distributed condoms and lubricant to students at information stands, through information sessions and workshops, and by actively engaging with students on campuses across Ireland.

World AIDS Day

Four services and organisations (STI Services, Dublin North East, HSE Health Promotion Longford, GOSHH, and AIDS West) actively engaged in condom and lubricant distribution during World AIDS Day, which was held on December 1, 2017. These services and organisations engaged in activities such as setting up information stands through which they provided individuals with condoms, lubricant and sexual health promotion information material.

• LGBT Pride

Two NGOs (AIDS West and GOSHH) stated that they distributed condoms and lubricant during LGBT Pride in 2017. Activities included supplying LGBT social venues with condoms and setting up information stands.

Festivals

The SHCPP Outreach team distributed condoms and lubricant sachets at a number of festivals including: LIFE, Forbidden Fruit, Body and Soul, Sea Sessions, Longitude, Galway Races, Beatyard, Castlealooza, and Electric Picnic.

• Outreach Activities

Fourteen services and organisations (listed below) distributed condoms and lubricant during outreach activities during 2017, separate to the activities discussed above.

Summary

The information in this report highlights how the NCDS is working with partners in the statutory, NGO and student sectors to reach groups who are at increased risk of negative sexual health outcomes. Condoms and lubricant sachets were distributed to a broad range of at-risk groups in 2017, including MSM, young people, students, asylum seekers, drug-users, sex workers, people who are homeless, STI clinic patients, people living with HIV, individuals who identify as LGBT, and people with addiction issues. The products were distributed via one-to-one sessions in clinical settings, education settings and a range of outreach and health promotion activities nationwide.
