


# National Condom Distribution Service Report of activities for 2021









#### **About the National Condom Distribution Service**

The National Condom Distribution Service (NCDS) was established by the HSE Sexual Health and Crisis Pregnancy Programme (SHCPP) in October 2015 to help meet the strategic aims of the National Sexual Health Strategy 2015–2020¹: to improve sexual health and well-being and reduce negative sexual health outcomes, such as sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and crisis pregnancies.

The NCDS functions as a central point for distributing free condoms and lubricant sachets to HSE services and other organisations working directly with individuals and groups who may be at increased risk of negative sexual health outcomes. The NCDS also supplies condoms and lubricant sachets to support sexual health promotion campaigns and educational initiatives. For more information on the NCDS, please click here

#### **About this report**

This report presents information on the activities of the NCDS from 1 January to 31 December 2021. It outlines the organisations that ordered condoms and lubricant sachets from the NCDS during this period, who they work with, and how they distributed the products.

The data sources for this report include: logistical information provided by the company responsible for dispatching orders on behalf of the HSE; a HSE database of orders; application forms submitted by organisations registered with the NCDS; and a monitoring report completed by organisations who ordered from the NCDS during 2021.

#### **COVID-19 and the NCDS**

The COVID-19 public health emergency that began in March 2020 continued through much of 2021. During this period, a range of subsequent public health measures affected services and organisations ordering from the NCDS. Examples of the impact of COVID-19 restrictions on these organisations included:

- · Limited service provision or temporary service closures at times among public STI clinics.
- Third-level institution campuses were closed to the majority of students until Autumn 2021.
- Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) providing outreach in social and community settings were restricted by venue closures, cancellation of events and festivals, and restrictions on face-to-face engagements.

As a result, 2021 demand continued to be lower than in 2019 and was in line with demand for 2020. However, the number of condoms ordered from the third-level sector increased as a result of students returning to campus in Autumn 2021.

#### **About the Sexual Health and Crisis Pregnancy Programme**


The SHCPP is a Policy Priority Programme in Health and Wellbeing, Strategy and Research, under the directorship of Healthcare Strategy in the HSE, and it is responsible for implementing the National Sexual Health Strategy 2015–2020.

The SHCPP delivers a programme of research; funding initiatives, including crisis pregnancy counselling services; education and training initiatives; clinical initiatives; communications campaigns; and information provision.
















## Overview of NCDS from 2015 to 2021
